A TALE OF TRAILERS AND SAILORS Pocket Cruisers Come To Havasu Feb. 13-20

My name is Sean Mulligan. Please let me lead off with, I drive a fire truck for a living. I am not a promoter or publicist. However, I want to tell you about some wonderful people who have changed my life, and I think that there is something a little unique, if not odd, going on in the dead of winter in the middle of the Arizona Desert. Here's the story:

Desert Dweller/Sailor

I have been an avid recreational sailor my entire life. Strange I suppose, because I have always lived in the desert. Lucky for me. I reside on the banks of the Colorado River, Lake Havasu City, to be exact.

Alas, though, little Lake Havasu has grown up over the past 40 years and the summer tourist crowd that comes here has changed drastically. Havasu has become known as a "Mecca" for loud, large, and fast powerboats, jet-skis, and the Spring Break "anything-goes" atmosphere.
Sailboats were left in the dust and even-

tually sailing all but died here save a few hardy souls who sail in the winter time when the "boys of summer" are nowhere to be found

passion, my wife, dog, and I began traveling in search of others of similar tastes. You see, we sail a type of boat called a "Trailer Sailor" or a "Pocket Cruiser."

This is a very capable sailboat, but it is still small enough to be towed behind a vehicle. This makes trips to far-away places a much more realistic endeavor for folks like us, working folks, with limited vacation time and funds.

The trailer sailor allows us to travel at

highway speeds (instead of sailboat speeds) to new locations, rig and launch our boats, and then set out to explore a new area.

We had heard of some groups of trailer sailors who met regularly in different locations for adventures ranging from a simple a day-sail, to multi-week long adventures that covered hundreds of miles on the water. We tried it and were hooked





Pre-Departure Checklist

You can help assure a good time while operating your vessel by performing this pre-departure check.

- Check the weather forecast for the area and timeframe during which you will be boating. High winds create hazardous conditions for
- ✓ Make sure that the steering and throttle controls operate properly and all lights are working properly.
- Check for fuel leaks from the tank, fuel lines, and carburetor.
- Check the engine compartment for oil leaks.
- Check hose connections for leaks or cracks, and make sure hose clamps are tight
- Drain all water from the engine compartment, and be sure the bilge plug is replaced and secure.
- Check to be sure you have a fully charged engine battery and fire extinguishers
- switch and wrist lanyard are in good order
- Make sure you have the required number of life jackets (personal flotation devices or PFDs). and check that they are in good condition.
- ✓ Leave a float plan with a reliable friend or



Don't Be Fooled By **Arizona Winters**

Arizona winters are mild, and recreational boating is popular year-round, but an unexpected immersion into cold water can cause hypothermia and even lead to a life-threatening situation.

Entering extremely cold water causes an immediate gasp reflex that can fill the lungs with water. After falling overboard or entering the water, it is important to be wearing your life jacket (PFD). A life jacket keeps your head above water and

your body on the surface.

Stay calm and move slowly. Don't try to take off clothing in the water (a com-mon misconception is that heavy clothing or waders weigh down your body when in fact can trap air and help keep your body afloat).

If your boat has capsized, stay with it. More than likely, it will not sink and it can be used as a platform to maneuver, so stay on top of it as much as possible, getting yourself out of the water and maintaining stability.





The rainbow trout stocking season is in full swing and will continue all winter long at two-week intervals. Trout range in size from 11 to 12 inches in length, with some recently stocked fish in the 14- to 16-inch

Fishing is good-to-excellent for anglers using scented dough baits (such as Power Bait), worms or cheese. Small spinners such as Rooster Tails and Panther Martins, or spoons such as KastMasters and Super Dupers work well for trout.

In addition to a good morning bite,


some anglers have reported ex-

Is The 'Alabama Rig' Legal In Arizona?

Arizona guidance is found in statute and the definition for Angling: Arizona Revised Statutes 17-101 A1—"Angling" means the taking of fish by one line and not to exceed two hooks, by one line and one artificial lure, which may have attached more than one hook, or by one line and not to exceed two artificial flies or lures.

The Alabama rig appears to be up to five (or more) lures joined via stiff wires, similar to umbrella rigs used for trolling. These "rigs" with more than two lures, would not be legal for angling in Arizona. Such a "rig" would be legal if it had no more than two lures.

Lures are not defined in statute. However, a lure is designed and intended to catch one fish. As such, a spoon, soft bait, piece of yarn etc., with no hook incorporated would not be considered a lure.

rated would not be considered a lure.

Thus, a test would be if a "rig" (Alabama or otherwise) were to be de-con-

structed, each piece that can catch a fish separately would be considered a lure. If more than two lures (that can catch a fish separately) are de-constructed, the rig is not legal in Arizona as regulations are currently written.


An example of a rig that would be legal in AZ is a rig with two swim baits with hooks and three or more (as many as you want) hook less swim baits or hookless spinners.

Paper applications can be submitted

now either by U.S. mail to Arizona Game and Fish Department, P.O. Box 74020, Phoenix, AZ 85087-1052, or hand-delivered to any Game and Fish office.

Deadline Coincides With State's 100th

The deadline to apply is Tuesday, Feb. 14, 2012 by 7 p.m. (MST). For those mailing their applications, remember, postmarks do not count.

A 2012 hunting license is required to apply in the draw, and hunters are reminded that licenses purchased through the draw will not be mailed out until after the drawing process is completed.

Licenses can also be purchased online at the Game and Fish website, or you can purchase your license at any Game and Fish office or more than 300 license dealers statewide.

Please keep in mind that you must have a working printer handy if you pur-chase your license online. The online system is self-fulfilling and you must print your license at time of purchase.

Early Application Has Advantage

Apply early to take advantage of the "correction period." If your application has an error and is received before 5 p.m. on Jan. 20, 2012, you will receive up to three phone calls from Game and Fish in a 24-hour period to help get the applica-tion corrected. After that date, mistakes can cause your application to be rejected.

The printed Pronghorn Antelope and Elk Hunt Draw Information booklets are now available at department offices and at license dealers statewide.

Elk Poaching Information Needed

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. — The Arizona Game and Fish Department is seeking the public's assistance in finding the individual or individuals responsible for illegally killing bull elk in two unrelated poaching incidents in northern Arizona.

The first poaching occurred on Nov. 25 during a rifle bull elk season in Game Management Unit 6A on the Coconino National Forest. Officers investigating the case received information about a 5 x 6 bull elk found in the 29 Mile Lake Area, which is approximately one mile west of the intersection of Highways 260 and 87.

Evidence at the scene indicates that the elk was left to waste since it was not field dressed and none of the edible meat was removed. During the initial investigation, tire tracks were discovered, and it is believed the suspect vehicle has a short wheel base. A reward of up to \$2,000 may be available for information leading to the arrest of the violator(s)

Second On The Kaibab

The other poaching occurred on Dec. 2 during a cow elk hunt in Game Management Unit 8 on the Kaibab National Forest. The spike bull was shot and left to waste south of Nagiller Tank, which is southwest of the Hat Ranch.

Investigating officers discovered shell casings from a 30.06 caliber rifle at the scene, and a bullet from the carcass of the animal. This evidence may be helpful, but information from the public is still needed to solve this case. A reward of up to \$1,350 may be available for information leading to the arrest of the violator(s)

'We realize that occasionally mistakes happen, but we need anyone with information to come forward and help solve these cases," says Wildlife Manager Mike Rice.

Sonoran Pronghorn **Return To King Valley**

YUMA, Ariz. - For the first time in over 100 years, Sonoran pronghorn are residing in King Valley on the Kofa National Wildlife Refuge in southwestern Arizona.

The Sonoran pronghorn have been protected under the Endangered Species Act since 1967, and the United States population was on the brink of extinction in 2002 due to habitat fragmentation, human disturbance, loss of forage and perennial rivers, and periods of extreme drought.

In early 2011, construction was ap-

proved for a 0.5 square mile captive breeding and release facility in King Valley, a location historically occupied by the species, to establish a population, expand its range, and bolster pronghorn numbers

The new breeding facility in King Val-ley was completed in December and the transfer of animals from a captive breeding facility on the Cabeza Prieta National Wildlife Refuge took place on Dec. 15.

Twelve pronghorn (two bucks and 10 does) are currently residing in the pen and being monitored by the Arizona Game and Fish Department. By 2013, it is anticipated that the two-year-old offspring will be released from the facility into suitable adjacent habitat.

The Arizona Game and Fish Department and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service would like to remind visitors to King Valley that the captive breeding pen and a 1/4 mile area surrounding the captive breeding facility are posted and closed to public access for the safety of the animals.

Heritage Fund Helps Arizona's Sandhill Cranes, Communities Grow

Cranes increase by more than 30.000 and provide spectacular viewing opportunities.

From just over 4,000 in the late 1970s to over 34,000 today, more sandhill cranes are calling Arizona their winter home, in part thanks to the Heritage Fund. The Heritage Fund, which was created by a voterinitiative to use Arizona Lottery dollars to support wildlife conservation, has been used to help secure ideal habitat for the birds in southeastern Arizona.

'One reason for the increasing number of cranes in the Sulfur Springs Valley is the availability of prime wetland habitat that the birds require and that the Game and Fish Department has provided. Cranes that used to fly south to Mexico now stop in Arizona because of those habitats," said Mike Rabe, a migratory bird biologist with the Arizona Game and Fish Department.

A Thrilling Sight

The impressive increase in sandhill cranes means good news for wildlife enthusiasts. Seeing hundreds or even thousands of cranes take to the skies, feed in the fields or come in to land is a thrilling sight. Sandhill cranes are large birds; adults have about an 80-inch wingspan and can stand about 47 inches tall.

The cranes will remain in southeastern Arizona until mid-late February, so there is still plenty of time to see and hear thousands of them," said Joe Yarchin, watchable wildlife program manager for

Benefits Communites

The Heritage Fund's direct impact on wildlife conservation is compounded by the economic benefit that wildlife viewing has on communities across the state, espe-cially in rural areas. The city of Willcox estimates that \$60,000 to \$80,000 comes into the local economy from hotel, gas, restaurant, and other related purchases just during Wings over Willcox, a four-day bird-viewing event.

Two of the department's wildlife

Peoples Canyon Receives Influx Of Bighorn Sheep

Translocation to provide data, increase diversity.

KINGMAN, Ariz. - Arizona Game and Fish biologists and several volunteers waited patiently as the doors to a bighorn sheep transport were pulled open.

At first the bighorn sheep were a bit reluctant, but after the first one took off in a gallop to begin exploring its new home, the others were quick to follow, leaping from the transport and bolting for the hill-

Such was the scene during the most recent supplemental transplant conducted by Game and Fish at Peoples Canyon (also known as Peeples Canyon) in Unit 16A where 20 bighorn sheep, captured on the Navajo Nation in southeast Utah, were re-

While a small population of bighorn sheep exists in the area just west of U.S.



Highway 93 near Bagdad, Ariz., this transplant is expected to boost both the numbers and genetic diversity within the herd

Fitted With Tags, Collars

The influx of bighorn sheep into the area was composed of 15 ewes and five rams. All were fitted with ear tags and half were fitted with GPS collars for monitoring. The collars will provide information on movement throughout the range, and mortality information, if any mortalities occur. "This translocation project is part of a

Endangered California Condors Celebrate 15th Anniversary

PHOENIX — The endangered California condor population that now spans Arizona and Utah is celebrating a significant milestone this month: the 15th anniversary of the first release of the birds into Arizona after being gone from the area for nearly 100 years. In December 1996, six condors were

released from an acclimation pen atop the Vermilion Cliffs in northern Arizona. Today, the population consists of more than 70 birds that now also use Utah as part of

"This milestone is a significant accomplishment for the reintroduction program and demonstrates what cooperative, adaptive conservation can do for wildlife," says Eric Gardner, nongame branch chief for the Arizona Game and Fish Department. "We would not have any condors flying over Arizona and Utah if it were not for the experimental, nonessential designation that allowed the project to begin. Now we have over 70 birds

Challenges Identified

Since reintroduction began, challenges have been identified in the program and adaptive management has been implemented to address issues like lead poisoning from spent ammunition and predation.

Of 42 known mortalities, 19 birds have died from confirmed lead poisoning. The second leading cause of death is predation with 12 cases recorded.

The Arizona Game and Fish Department implemented a voluntary non-lead ammunition program in 2005 for hunters drawn for hunts in the condor's core range. The free program has had voluntary participation rates of between 80 and 90 percent each of the past five years, demonstrating the willingness of hunters to play an active role in conservation and that voluntary programs can be successful.

To continue to address lead's impact on condors, Utah implemented a non-lead program in 2010 to further conservation as the population of condors expands its habitat into southern Utah. Biologists expect to see a reduction in lead toxicity deaths once more Utah hunters begin to use non-lead ammunition in the field.

Special Rule Provides Flexibility

The Arizona-Utah condor population is classified as an experimental, non-essential population by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service under the 10(j) rule of the Endangered Species Act. This special rule provides The Peregrine Fund and Game and Fish with more flexibility to manage the population

The 10(j) rule allows the agencies the ability to handle, treat, transport and fit birds with radio transmitters, activities that would be much more difficult to carry out without the special designation. The 10(j) rule also provides that land management practices will not be restricted due to the presence of condors.

Condors are a long-lived species with low reproductive rates, making its population more slow-growing than most wildlife. While they can live up to 60 years in the wild, they do not sexually mature until six or seven years of age and only mate every other year.

From 22 To 400
The California condor has gone from only 22 birds left in the world in 1982 to nearly 400 today. The original 22 birds were captured in an effort to breed and save the species. Condors bred and raised in captivity are now periodically released at sites in California, Mexico and at the Vermilion Cliffs in Arizona.

The species was added to the federal endangered species list in 1967. The condor is the largest flying land bird in North America. The birds can weigh up to 26

Grand Canyon's Trail Of Time Receives National Recognition

Grand Canyon, Ariz. — The Trail of Time, located on the South Rim of Grand Canyon National Park, recently won an Interpretive Media Award from the National Association for Interpretation (NAI).

The award, first place in the Wayside Exhibit category, recognizes and promotes excellence in the delivery of natural, cultural, and historical non-personal interpretive services (things like visitor center exhibits, waysides and brochures where a ranger is not physically present to facilitate visitor understanding and appreciation.)

Trail Of Time Reveals Geologic Timeline

The Trail of Time follows the existing, paved Rim Trail between the Yavapai Geology Museum and the Verkamp's Visitor Center on the South Rim of Grand Canyon National Park. It is an interpretive walking timeline that focuses on Grand Canyon vistas and rocks, and invites visitors to ponder, explore, and understand the magnitude of geologic time and the stories encoded in Grand Canyon's rock layers

and landscapes.

The timeline is marked by brass markers every meter, representing one million years of time, and viewing tubes and other interpretive materials help visitors connect the rocks visible in the Grand Canyon to their place along the geologic timeline.

First proposed in 1995 by University

of New Mexico geology professor, Dr. Karl Karlstrom, the Trail was funded by an Informal Education Grant from the National Science Foundation in 2005 and completed in 2010.

The Trail of Time is part of a research program in informal science education aimed at understanding and improving public understanding of the connection between human time scales and the million year heartbeat of the Earth.

"Park visitors seem to love to touch the rocks, do trail activities, and study the waysides, all in the context of great views within one of the world's most spectacular landscapes," says Dr. Karlstrom

A Collaborative Effort

The Trail of Time was a collaborative effort between the National Park Service, the University of New Mexico, Arizona State University, the University of Massachusetts, and the National Science Foundation.

"I speak for the entire Trail of Time planning team in saying we are honored to

have received first place for Wayside Exhibits from the National Association for Interpretation," Dr. Karlstrom concluded.

The National Association for Interpretation is a not-for-profit professional association whose membership is involved in the interpretation of natural and cultural heritage resources in settings such as parks, zoos, museums, nature centers, aquaria, botanical gardens, and historic sites.

The Association encourages networking, training, and collaboration among members and partners in support of their mission: inspiring leadership and excellence to advance heritage interpretation as a profession.

Travel Management Public Comment Period Begins

Environmental assessment re: Tonto National Forest starts.

Tonto National Forest officials are seeking comments on the Travel Management Environmental Assessment (EA). The 30-day comment period began Jan. 6.

The action is a proposed system of

roads, trails and areas. Based on previous public input, several alternatives are proposed in this draft Environmental Assessment (EA). The final product will be a Motor Vehicle Use Map (MVUM) that shows which roads and trails will be open to motor vehicle use. The decision will also amend the Tonto National Forest Plan

In 2005, the Department of Agriculture

enacted a new planning rule to manage motorized vehicle use on all national forests and grasslands. This rule requires the Tonto National Forest to designate those roads, trails, and areas that are open to motor vehicle use. Designations will be made by class of vehicle and, if appropriate, by time of year.

The final rule will prohibit the use of motor vehicles off the designated system, as well as use of motor vehicles on routes and in areas that are not consistent with the designations.

"Public involvement at this time is a critical component in developing a motorized travel system," stated Sharon Wallace, Public Services group leader. "During this comment period, we are hoping to get representative viewpoints and suggestions from a cross-section of forest visitors.

"The purpose of the Motor Vehicle Use Map is to comply with the requirements of the Travel Management Rule, to reduce problems caused by uncontrolled off-road travel, and to improve the current system of travel routes for public access and enjoyment. The development of a Motor Vehicle Use Map is an adaptive process in which future changes can be made in the public interest."

waterfowl, Bill Williams River National Wildlife Refuge offers a little bit of everything for both wildlife and people.

Located just 23 miles from Lake Havasu City, the area features a one-quarter mile trail for nature watching and boating at no-wake speed (which is as slow and quiet as you get). There's also a boat ramp for non-motorized watercraft only.

The rare riparian habitat of Bill Williams River NWR is also criss-crossed by a number of hiking trails where one is likely to see the tracks of cottontails, javelina, and deer, as well as predatory coyotes, bobcats, and the less-common (For cougars. information:www.fws.gov/southwest/refu ges/arizona/billwill.html)

What's SUP?

There's plenty "SUP," the abbreviation for stand-up paddling, a sport growing nationwide in leaps and bounds. Those en-thusiasts standing up and paddling on what appears to be a surfboard now have a new way to glide silently along the Bridgewater

Channel, just below the home of thousands of bats who nest within the London Bridge, which was relocated to Lake Havasu City and placed into service 40 years ago this year. (www.standupconnec-

Aloha Arizona

A group of dedicated canoeists are keeping Pacific Island culture alive by paddling a fleet of outrigger canoes. There's perhaps no better way to appreciate the almost two-dozen replica light-houses that dot the shore of the lake.

Paddle Past Petroglyphs

He painted virtually all of the world's great saltwater game species, and his art dominated the sporting press for decades. If you picked up an outdoor magazine or tournament program from the eras of Kennedy to Reagan, you've undoubtedly seen his work. Those were oil paintings
— not photographs — and no other artist has ever done it better.

Now five years after his death, the art world and sporting press have rediscovered Meltzoff's talent and are once again clamoring for his imagery. Three new art exhibitions will open this year that include Meltzoff art as their touchstones.

First Meltzoff Showing In Texas

The first is Art of the Dive, a multi-media show curated by the noted David Wagner that will open its doors at the Art Museum of South Texas in Corpus Christi on Jan. 19. Art of the Dive includes five signature Meltzoff oil paintings that are breathtaking in their execution.

Ft. Lauderdale Showing Features Shark!

Later this spring, the Museum of Art in Fort Lauderdale opens an exhibition titled Shark! and will feature one of Meltzoff's most iconic pictures. This over-sized work was completed in 1988 and has never before been in public view.

Titled Broadbill, Mako, and Lancet Fish in the Glow of the Cyalumes, the dark and dangerous painting will be on prominent display as a highlight of the show. Curated by prominent author/artist Richard Ellis, Shark! opens May 13 and will run throughout the summer.

Over 75 Originals In New York City

Finally, the venerable Society of Illustrators in New York will turn over its brownstone gallery to a one-man Meltzoff show this summer from June 6 through

July 28.

This once-in-a-lifetime exhibition will include more than 75 original Meltzoff paintings crossing the expanse of his varied career. Many were Meltzoff's favorite pieces and never sold by him nor loaned for display.

Included in the mix will be more than two dozen game fish paintings covering all the great species: billfish, bonefish, permit, striped bass, swordfish, tuna, and others. Navajo Nation and Arizona Game and Fish for wildlife management both on the Navajo Nation and in Arizona," said Brian Wakeling, Game and Fish game branch chief.

Wakeling explained an additional 22 bighorn sheep were captured on the Navajo Nation: three for the Navajo Nation Zoo and Botanical Park, and 19 radio-tagged and released for study

within the Upper San Juan River basin.

Minimize Predation

To aid in the recovery of desert bighorn sheep in the area, the Game and Fish Commission has authorized a multiple bag limit and use of artificial light for mountain lions in the southern portion of Unit 16A so hunters can assist with the recovery of the translocated bighorns.

With a robust mountain lion population in the area, the goal will be to minimize the influence of predation.

"The commission believes the new regulations will benefit bighorn sheep and allow this re-established population to grow and allow for suitable recruitment to restore this historical population for future generations to enjoy," said Commission Chair Robbie Woodhouse.

Such measures in regards to mountain lions are in place in the southern portions of Unit 18B where bighorn sheep were reintroduced in 2006 and received a supplemental transplant in 2007.

Funding for the translocation was raised by the Arizona Desert Bighorn Sheep Society through the sale of special big game license tags, with the Game and Fish Department handling and overseeing the capture, transport, and release of the bighorn sheep.


