#### Wildlife Manager For A Decade

After a decade in the field as a wildlife manager, Voyles rose through the ranks serving as the Department's first Law Enforcement Training Coordinator, then Re-gional Supervisor and ultimately the position of Director, which he has held since 2008.

His term will be remembered for his embrace of technology to modernize the department, his national efforts to unite state conservation agencies to provide better resources for wildlife and habitat management, and his support of multiple-use public lands

#### **Register your watercraft**

Make sure the vessel's registration is current before heading out on the water. It's one of the most important boating requirements needed to operate a watercraft on Arizona waterways

The registration fee is determined by watercraft length and ranges from \$20 to \$66 for Arizona residents and \$100 to \$495 for non-residents. Skip the line and renew your watercraft registration online at www.azgfd.gov/boating

#### Know the Rules: Learn to identify "Navi-Aids"

Arizona law enforcement agencies write many citations for "failure to obey naviga-tion laws." You can help ensure the safety of all on the water by learning to identify these common navigational aids.

Information

Squares indicate where to find food, supplies, repairs, etc. and give directions and other information.

#### Controlled

Circles indicate a controlled area such as speed limit, no fishing or anchoraing, ski only or no skiing, or "slow, no wake."



Crossed diamonds indicate areas off-limits to all vessels such as swimming areas, dams, and spillways.

#### Danger

Diamonds warn of dangers such as rocks, shoals, con-struction, dams, or stumps. Always proceed with caution.

#### **Other Non-Lateral Markers**

Safe Water Markers are white with red vertical stripes and mark mid-channels or fairways. They may be passed on either side

**Inland Water Obstruction** Markers are white with black vertical stripes and indicate an should not pass between these buoys and nearest shore.

#### **Mooring Buoy**

Mooring Buoys are round and white with a blue horizontal band and are found in marinas and other areas where vessels are allowed to anchor. Note, the following actions are illegal:

Willfully damaging, removing, interfering with, or tying up to a navagation buoy not intended for mooring ◆ Mooring, anchoring, or fastening to shore for more than 14 consecutive days any vessel on public waters.

Need to borrow a life jacket? Visitors to lakes Pleasant, Havasu, Saguaro or Mohave needing a life jacket can borrow one at Life Jacket Loaner

Stations near each lake's boat ramps. Stations contain jackets for infants to adults. Please return the jackets so they can be used by others.

Traveling soon? Spending time on the water makes any vacation special, and boating in Miami, Florida offers a beautiful way to spend the day. Miami offers so many places to see and explore from the water that after your visit, you just might decide to become a Floridian!

#### Scenic Options Abound

Miami offers many options for route and scenery. You may wish to begin your cruise in Biscayne Bay, where the skyline of Miami enhances the day with its color and art deco-to- modern influences.

One of the best introductions to Miami by water is to cruise by the celebrity homes. Three islands known as Hibiscus Island, Star Island and Palm Island clustered just north of the MacArthur Causeway showcase a variety of architectural styles and beautiful landscaping. Fisher Island at the mouth of the Miami River is another location to cruise by for great pictures. This 216-acre island is home to high net worth individuals and is only reachable by water, and not to the public.

#### **Ready For Lunch?**

Ready for lunch? Speaking of the Miami River, one of the hottest places for waterside dining in Miami is called Sea-spice. Enjoy the outdoor lounge and raw bar, plus full menu with inspiring fish dishes. Another waterfront restaurant is Zuma, offering modern Japanese cuisine from its location at the Epic Hotel. Enjoy the riverside terrace and perhaps some delicious sashimi or sushi?

Now that you've had your fill, it is time for more island hopping.

Island Hopping Pace Picnic Island, one of a group of islands just north of the Venetian Causeway and Biscayne Island in Biscayne Bay, makes for a fun stop by boat as well. Enjoy the beach, plan a picnic and relax while you take in the views of the mainland. You may be greeted by some Miami residents with long tails, aka iguanas. Another popular island is the historic

Flagler Memorial Island, also known as Monument Island. The man-made island showcases a 110-ft obelisk-shaped monument to honor Henry Flagler, a pioneer of Miami who founded the Florida East Coast Railway. At low tide, this uninhabited destination has an attractive beach and nice water for swimming. You'll find plenty of colorful boats bobbing at anchor while yachters hang out in the water with a cool drink. Here you can paddle kayaks, picnic, explore the monument and more.

A not-to-be-missed stop is the sandbar by Key Biscayne. Situated on the west side of Key Biscayne, this lively sandbar

is sometimes also called Nixon's Sandbar due to its proximity to Nixon's Cove, the site of former President Nixon's "Winter White House," which is no longer there. The Cove is a beautiful protected area, great for meandering and relaxing. When it's time to rev up the action, the nearby sandbar is the place to be. Here you'll find boats anchored, with people hanging out in the water, jet skiing, and, needing no excuse to have a great time!

#### Key Biscayne National Park

One mile south of Cape Florida in Key Biscayne National Park is another not-tobe-missed site, Stiltsville. This historic area of the Bay with homes and nightclubs on stilts used to be a hot spot for clubs, movie stars and epic parties. In fact, there were 27 structures in the 1950's and 60's. Now, the seven homes that remain are protected by the park service and there is no public access. You can cruise by and snap some pictures of Old Florida history.


Other sites to see by water as you head south include Vizcaya near Coconut Grove. Vizcaya is the historic home of International Harvester founder James Deering built in 1916, which is now a museum. There is no access by boat but it offers beautiful views by water.

#### **Coconut Grove**

Coconut Grove itself is worth disembarking for, a neighborhood known for its artsy, quaint atmosphere. Dock at Dinner Key Marina and take a walk to Coconut Grove village. You can wander the streets and enjoy the shops, and stop for a latte at a charming sidewalk café where you might just catch some live music to set the mood. Don't miss the famed CocoWalk for shopping. Coconut Grove is in the heart of Miami, but has its own personality of relaxation, music, food, events and more.

It's been said that everything is better when you're on the water. When adventure calls, exploring by boat is a wonderful activity for the whole family, and a great way to experience the cool, tropical vibe that makes Miami memorable.

## California's DBW Provides Survival Guide For 2017 Summer Season

Cold-water shock and life jackets are this year's key messages that apply to all those who recreate on the waterways of the Southwest.

As are Arizona's safety-conscious agencies, personnel and outdoor enthusiasts, California too is stressing the importance of water-wise prevention, procedures, and equipment.

California's Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) urges recreational boaters and water enthusiasts to take the necessary precautions this summer, starting with life jacket wear, to keep themselves and their loved ones safe. This summer season begins with some of the highest water levels and coldest water not seen or felt in many years. Swift and cold water can create treacherous conditions for everyone, including experienced swimmers.

Recreational boating fatalities related to swift water conditions are a tragic but yearly occurrence throughout California and the Southwest . These incidents are especially prevalent during California's high water years. In the midst of the state's drought or low water period of 2012-2016, DBW's annual boating accident statistics confirm that 23 fatalities occurred in swiftwater conditions. During the state's high water years of 1993, 1998, 2005, 2010 and 2011, that number more than doubled, with a total of 48 California residents losing their lives in swift water conditions.

"Summertime in California [and Arizona] always means heading to the water for some fun, and given the rainy season we've had, we're sure to see even more activity than usual on our waterways this said DBW's Deputy Director Lynn Sadler. "However, it is crucial for boaters and water enthusiasts to know that the water is running very cold. Jumping into cold

## What's In A Name?

#### In particular, what do boat names mean or imply?

The nation's largest recreational boating advocacy, services and safety group, Boat Owners Association of The United States (BoatUS), has issued its 2017 Top Ten Boat Names list, a tradi-tion dating back a quarter decade. The names come from tallying up requests for boat names to the BoatUS Graph-ics service, and each reveal much about the personality of the vessel's owner.

#### The BoatUS 2017 Top 10 Boat Names

1. Serenity: The utter calm and quietude boating brings 2. Seas the Day: A nautical wordplay

on the Latin saying Carpe diem, taking boating to its fullest

*3. Andiamo:* "Let's go!" in Italian and a perennial favorite boat name

4. Irish Wake: Mourning and merry-making after the death of a family mem-ber or friend

5. Freedom: Patriotic name that first appeared on the Top 10 Names List in 2004

6. *Adagio*: Italian for "at a slow tem-po." Represents how best po." Represents how boating reduces stress in our hectic lives

7. Ohana: From the Hawaiian culture,

meaning "family" in an extended sense 8. Oasis: A fertile spot in a desert where water is found; symbolizes boating's ability to refresh and nourish our daily lives

9. Happy Ours: A playful take on the good feeling you get at the afternoon communal cocktail time

10. Firefly: Making the list for the first

water can cause many effects, including an involuntary gasp for air when you're under water which can lead to panic and start the drowning process."

Cold-water immersion is dangerous. Not wearing a life jacket while recreating in cold water makes it even more perilous Education is the key. Following are the stages of cold-water immersion and some do's and don'ts:

#### Stages of Cold-Water Immersion:

*Cold Shock:* A person has one minute to adjust to the cold shock response. Swimming Failure: A person has about

10 minutes of meaningful movement to get help and get out of breathing. Post-Rescue Collapse: A person "gives

up" and collapses after or right at the time of rescue.

 Do not enter the water if it's too cold. The average body temperature is 98.6 degrees Fahrenheit. The average pool temperature is 84 to 86 degrees. Some of California's rivers are currently running at temperatures between 30 to 40 degrees. Such cold temperatures can literally take your breath away

Do control breathing, don't gasp. A sudden unexpected fall into cold water causes an involuntary gasp (or torso) re-flex. It takes less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of water in a person's lungs to drown. When someone remains calm, they have a greater chance of self-rescue.

· Don't panic if you fall into the water. Stay affoat with the help of a life jacket, regain control of breathing, and keep head above water in view of rescuers. If



possible, look for ways to increase buoyancy. If in the water with others, huddle together with everyone facing inwards to help everyone stay afloat and keep warm.Don't apply heat to extremities like

arms and legs of a rescued victims. This sudden change in temperature could cause cardiac arrest.

• Do make sure everyone is wearing a properly-fitted life jacket. Life jackets that are too big will ride up around your face. It it's too small, it will not be able to keep your body afloat. Life jackets de-signed for adults will not work for children.

• Do file a float plan with someone trusted that includes details about the trip, launch area, marina, boat, passengers, towing or trailer vehicle, communication equipment and emergency contacts

#### Some Good-To-Knows If You Are In California

DBW manages a number of safety programs and provides resources to encourage safe boating on California's waterways. Many programs and events kicked-off during National Safe Boating Week when recreational boating advo-cates from across the United States and Canada use this week before Memorial Day weekend to remind boaters on the importance of life jacket wear and other key safety messages.

Below are two of many California safety programs for 2017. The division encourages boaters and water enthusiasts both local and California boaters as well as those visiting the state - to take advantage of these resources.

· Life Jacket Loaner Stations: In partnership with public and private enti-ties, DBW provides life jackets to loaner boards within park units and loan stations so that an individual or family can borrow a life jacket for a day or a weekend by sim-ply completing a loan form.

· Free BoatCA app: DBW has developed a boating facility locator app version of its Web-based boating locator - Boat-CA. The free app offers an array of boating safety information, float plan emails, clean and green boating practices, as well as information on nearly 1,000 boating locations and facilities. The app is available now on iTunes. The Android version is coming soon.





The Arizona Game and Fish Department, together with boating professionals and enthusiasts nationwide, demonstrated the importance of remaining safe on the water by participating in Wear Your Life Jacket to Work Day on May 19.

The annual event, hosted by the National Safe Boating Council (NSBC) serves as a fun, educational element ahead of National Safe Boating Week, which ran this year from May 20 to May



26. The event helps to raise awareness of different life jacket types, while demonstrating their comfort and versatility by wearing them to work.

#### Today's Life Jackets

Are More Comfortable "The life jackets of today are simply more comfortable and will help to save your life," said Josh Hoffman, AZGFD Boating Safety Education coordinator.



"Arizona's boating season has returned and many have already hit the water. While our lakes offer great family fun, the simplest thing anyone can do to protect themselves is to put on a life jacket."

#### Drownings Cause 68 Percent Of Fatalities

U.S. Coast Guard statistics show that drowning was the reported cause of death in approximately 68 percent of recre-



approximately 85 percent of those who drowned were not wearing life jackets. Wear Your Life Jacket to Work Day

Wear Your Life Jacket to Work Day coincided with the official launch of the 2017 North American Safe Boating Campaign, which focuses on educating the boating public about the safety and comfort of life jackets.

#### Take A Picture

AZGFD and the National Safe Boating Council each asked participants to take a picture of themselves in their life jacket while at work and post it to the Ready, Set, Wear It! Facebook page (facebook.com/ readysetwearit) or submit directly to the NSBC at outreach@safeboatingcouncil. org. Participants were also encouraged to tweet their picture using #readysetwearit. #### Sobriety Checkpoint Held On Canyon Lake

The Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD) conducted a watercraft operating under the influence (OUI) checkpoint on Canyon Lake recently. The purpose of the checkpoint was to ensure people are operating their watercraft safely and responsibly and to apprehend those found to be operating their vessels under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

#### Systematic Safety Inspection

Throughout the weekend, some boaters were required to pass through a checkpoint and be subjected to a systematic safety inspection. Operators were checked for any sign of impairment from alcohol or drugs and asked to confirm that the required safety equipment, such as a proper number of life jackets and working fire extinguishers, were aboard. "Operating a boat while impaired is

"Operating a boat while impaired is just as dangerous, and just as illegal, as driving a vehicle while impaired," said Tim Holt, field supervisor for the AZGFD office in Mesa. "The illegal per se limit for blood alcohol concentration is .08 in both cases."

#### Canyon Lake Popular Recreation Venue

Canyon Lake is one of Arizona's most popular lakes for recreational boaters. In 2016, there were 16 boating accidents on Canyon Lake. Nationally, alcohol use was a factor in 17 percent of all fatalities and is the leading known contributor in fatal boating accidents, according to the U.S. Coast Guard.

Using a checkpoint can not only increase the number of contacts with boaters, but also provide valuable data on the amount of alcohol consumption related to recreational boating on Arizona's waterways.

#### Not Only 'Looks Great'



In 1999 Johnny was watching Channel 11 and it was all just stills for the fishing show. He asked if a guy if they could



## Wild West Bass Trail Team Championship Draws Big Crowd In Payson

The Wild West Bass Trail is a relative newcomer on the bass tournament scene, but it was founded by people with tons of tournament fishing experience. They wanted to make the best tournament circuit out there, and they have spared no expense and worked their tails off — with great success.

Their mission is to promote the highest quality companies and provide premier fishing events in the western U.S. They have the highest guaranteed payout on the West Coast, and tournaments are televised so pro anglers get lots of exposure.

#### Impressive, Careful Weigh-Ins

We went to the weigh-in for the Wild West Bass Trail Team Championship at Roosevelt Lake on May 6, then the final weigh-in at the Green Valley Park in Payson on Sunday the 7th.

First off, I was incredibly impressed with the lengths they go to in order to ensure the health of the bass that are weighed in. There are rows of aerated tanks, and they had even added ice to the tanks to cool the water off in order to destress the fish and allow the water to hold more oxygen.

They also have an enormous pontoon boat with aerated tanks, and after being weighed, the fish are put in tanks on this boat, and released from the boat back into the lake.

#### **Only The Top Teams**

Since this was the championship, only the top finishing teams from 2017 fished. Here's how it works: a team fishes at least three of the WWBT Team events for the year. At every tournament, your final weight and the place you finished gives you a certain number of points. First place is 250 points, etc.

At the end of the year, the 50 teams with the highest points (providing they fished at least 3 events) are invited to fish the Championship. The prize for the winning the Championship is a brand new Ranger Boat, so of course everyone wants that. There were 42 teams fishing this year.

#### So Many Things Can Make Or Break A Day

I spoke with Raoul Ramirez, and he said that he and his brother fished hard and just had some bad breaks. They had a bad time during the practice days be-

cause of an algae bloom on the lake, but they moved into the Tonto end and caught some bed fish, then all the rest came on Skinny Dippers (small plastic swim baits by Reaction Innovations). On day one of the tournament they

On day one of the tournament they had a limit and culled three times, but on day 2 they only weighed four fish — bite number 5 was a 4- to 5-pounder that got off. If they'd caught that fish, the weight would have been enough to put them in the top ten. In addition to losing that big fish, they had an electrical fire on day one, and their trolling motor cable broke on day two. So many things come together to make or break your day!

#### Fishing Was Tough; The Crowd Was Big

The teams fished Friday and Saturday, and their weights for both those days were combined. The top ten teams after Saturday moved on, and the other 32 teams went home. Fishing was tough, but there were some excellent fishermen in the tournament and some beautiful fish were weighed in.

The town of Payson, Arizona, turned the final weigh-in into a festival with live music, western shooting reenactments, food, and vendors. There was quite a crowd as the ten boats pulled into the park, and the audience was very enthusiastic and cheered each fish and every team. Wild West Bass Trail is completely professional and impressively organized, and the weigh-in went smoothly.

Almost every team remarked on the

size of the crowd. The anglers reported catching most of their fish on A-rigs, Senkos, and small swimbaits.

The local boys: Johnny Johnson of Pinetop and Clifford Pirch, originally from Payson, got a lot of cheers, but in the end, Michael Perry and David Burns were crowned team champions and received a total of \$39,000, including \$25,000 for first place. Perry and Burns were in the U.S. Army together and they're a couple of great guys. They said they decided to fish WWBT and just have some fun, and when they got invited to the championship they figured what the heck, let's go see what happens. I bet they're glad they went!

## LAKE POWELL REPORT **Spring Fishing Is Now At Its Peak**

The quality of life is measured by the amount of time spent fishing.

Surface water temperature today and for most of the week was 64 degrees. End of report!

For those who need a bit more information, here are the details:

Striped bass adults prefer a tempera-ture of 64 degrees. At this comfort level, trophy size fish, adults, and juveniles have free reign and can travel in any direction, any depth and feed anywhere. Trophy fish cannot handle warmer water and must stay in the 64 degree range. Adult fish are found close to the warm surface layer now and can be found by shallow troll-ing and casting. Young stripers are near the surface and are eating plankton until they find young shad. They are also sus-ceptible to trolling and casting.

Females Are Hungry Now Large and smallmouth bass spawn when water temperature is from 60-66. Male bass guard nests and are often seen in shallow water. Females feed ravenously now as they are very active and excited about spawning. Bass are in shal-low water and very catchable on open water reefs and along the rocky shoreline. This activity level, along with desire to feed more in warmer water, makes bass very active and easier to catch

#### **Crappie Feeding Priority**

Crappie are nearing the end of their spawning season. Feeding has become the higher priority. Crappie are still very active and quite catchable

#### Walleye Very Active

Walleye have completed spawning but are reacting to warming by feeding at a higher level. They are known to feed ear-ly and late but this temperature range has them feeding extremely well at mid day (10 am - 2 pm). Walleye are very active

and will continue to increase in activity as water temperature increases into the low 70s. They will do even better as the water continues to warm.

#### Blugill Larger Now

Bluegill and green sunfish increase their feeding behavior as water warms to 65-70. It takes only a few more degrees before spawning occurs. Bluegill activity level has increased dramatically. Fish size has also increased recently (perhaps due to mussels in their diet?) as many larger size bluegill have been seen recent-ly. Larger bluegill feeding voraciously makes a whole new sport fishery possible in Lake Powell. Big fish are now avail-able in large schools in 12-25 feet of 64 degree water.

#### Cats Easier To Catch

Even channel catfish are responding to the warming water. They spawn as the water warms into the 70s. That is a ways off but their feeding level has increased. Catfish are now easier to catch

#### **Best Time For Spring Fishing**

In summary, the very best water tem-erature for spawning, feeding and activity is now available to all sport fish in the lake. This is the best time to fish in the springtime.

Therefore, it is not surprising that our fishing trip today was awesome. We mo-tored uplake to Face Canyon and then tried

Trolling was very successful as we seldom went more than 5 minutes without catching a striper or smallmouth bass. Each time we hooked a fish trolling the other angler would reel in fast and then cast to the shallow shoreline to get another hookup. When we had worked over a productive shoreline and failed to get another hook up we moved on.

We found great success using this technique and moving from Face Canyon, to Buoy 25 coves and shoreline, Gregory Butte coves, mouth of West Canyon and Dove Canyon, and finally Dungeon Canyon

#### A Good Time To Catch

Our catch included 30 stripers, 25 large and smallmouth bass, and 2 large bluegill (caught trolling). The weather was agree-able with a mild day in between windy wants indecent streamerture and creat events, pleasant air temperature, and great satisfaction while catching many fish with short stays in many places. Spring fishing is now at its peak. If you want to catch fish now is a good time to come to the lake. At press time, lake elevation was 3610 and water temperature was 63-66F.

I had an opportunity this past month to escape the looming desert heat and visit with my son in Portland, Ore. Part of our get together involved going salmon fishing in the Tilamook Bay area.

## **Fishing Tournaments Suspended On Apache, Canyon And Saguaro Lakes**

To protect large fish that are targeted by tournament anglers, the Arizona Game and Fish Department has requested that the USDA Forest Service temporarily suspend angler tournaments from Apache, Canyon and Saguaro Lakes until environmental conditions improve.

#### Golden Alga Blooms

Golden alga blooms have developed over large portions of Saguaro and Apache Lakes. Golden alga produces a toxin (prymnesin) that affects any organism with gills. Currently, the primary species that is being affected is threadfin shad. However, sunfish in Saguaro have also begun to die and Asiatic clams are dying by the tens of thousands. Golden alga toxin can be detected by fish and they will seek areas of refuge were they can recover; however, clams can't move and they die where they live.

These bass were caught in an area of no or low toxicity and released in an area of an active toxic golden alga bloom. Other than threadfin shad, no other dead fish species were observed at the release site (no sunfish, catfish, carp or small dead bass were encountered).

Some tournament participants stated they were having difficulty keeping their bass alive in the live well. If fish are caught below a toxic layer and placed in a live well, the golden alga toxin can then be delivered straight to the fish if the bloom is active on the surface. Basically, these fish were removed from an area where they could survive to an area where they could not.

#### **Not A Public Health Threat**

Golden alga blooms are not a public health threat. The toxins that golden alga produce are only harmful to gill-breathing organisms such as fish and clams, and there is no evidence they are harmful to people, livestock or other animals. However, as a common sense precaution, fish that are found dead or dying should not be consumed.



The 27th annual Grand Canyon Star Party will be held from Saturday, June 17 through Saturday, June 24 on the South and North Rims of Grand Canyon National Park. National parks such as Grand Canyon are protective havens for some of the last remaining dark skies in this country.

Last year, Grand Canyon National Park announced its Provisional Interna-tional Dark Sky Park status through the International Dark-Sky Association. This provisional status gives the park three years to retrofit two-thirds of the lights in the park to be night-sky friendly. In 2016, 43 percent of the lights in the park were night sky friendly.

This year, we celebrate our continuing efforts to preserve this precious dark sky sanctuary while counting down to both Grand Canyon National Park's 100th birthday and full International Dark Sky Park status in 2019



## AZGFD Warns Of Increased Urban Wildlife Sightings

As state dries out, wildlife seeking food, water move closer to humans.

After a wet winter and mild spring, Arizona has seen an increase in many wildlife populations.

As summer approaches and dry conditions return statewide, several animals are instinctively moving closer to easy sources of food and water — wherever humans can be found. This has led to increased reports of bears, coyotes, mountain lions, bobcats and other wildlife in populated areas across the state, where lawns are watered, swimming pools are full, garbage cans are overflowing and dishes of pet food are left on back porches.

#### **Bears Spotted**

In May, bears have been spotted in Tucson, Rio Rico, Patagonia, Payson, Flagstaff and at campgrounds along the Mogollon Rim. Mountain lions are being spotted in suburban neighborhoods, foxes



have bitten two people and coyotes, as usual, are seen almost everywhere.

"This is the normal time of year to see wildlife on the move, and we need the public's help to keep wildlife out of trouble by eliminating things that attract wildlife into town," said Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD) Regional Supervisor Raul Vega. "When wild animals lose their fear of people, or see people as a food source, it almost always ends badly for the wildlife."

#### **Relocation First**

AZGFD will sometimes relocate wildlife that make it into town, but about 50 percent of relocated bears often return to the spot where they were first captured. A bear found in Tucson this week was



#### found last week peering into a cabin on Mt. Lemmon before moving into the Catalina Foothills and needed to be dispatched. A necropsy showed the bear's stomach contained pet food and garbage, indicating it was accustomed to feeding on trash and was lost its fear of humans. **Coyotes, Bobcats**

While there have been no confirmed mountain lion attacks on humans this

year, a dozen lion sightings have been reported in southern Arizona and several pets have been attacked by unknown wildlife in Fountain Hills and Scottsdale. AZGFD also receives regular reports of coyote and bobcat activity in both urban and suburban areas.

"The key to reducing danger from wildlife is to reduce things that attract wildlife," said Mark Hart, public information program manager for AZGFD's Tuc-

of food here but it has no comparison to South America, where lush greenery affords all kinds of wildlife a thriving place to live.

"The long journey to the United States, "The long journey to the United States, while possible for some males, seems to present a difficult obstacle for females, who by nature are less willing to cross the risky terrain of the borderlands."

#### Interpretation: What?!

You want me to go north from here, where I am content, have a wonderful life, can raise my litters and travel to Arizona? Are you crazy? I can just see the theoretical conversation between a male and female jaguar about taking a hike up to Arizona and settling down. Look, jaguar lovers: The reason you

Look, jaguar lovers: The reason you do not see females here is because the terrain is inhospitable to them. There is not an "abundance" of prey, the heat is horrific and if you look closely at the maps on where the predominant location of jaguars is, it's in South America!

"In 2016, the Fish and Wildlife Service dismissed millions of acres of habitat north of I-10, where the U.S. jaguar population could possibly reach 200 or more. This combination of omissions is a one-two knockout punch for U.S. jaguar recovery."

#### Interpretation: Correct

The United States Fish and Wildlife

correctly determined that the arid Arizona deserts are not great habitat for jaguars. Historically, female jaguars have been gone from the landscape in Arizona for over 50 years. The last female seen in Arizona was in 1963.

Something tells me that the females jaguars are a lot smarter than the males and those with bad genes are heading north to avoid the butt kicking they would get if they stayed around in Mexico. Think of Arizona as a bad version of a permanent vacation for jaguars that can't make the moves in Mexico.

"Now U.S. jaguars face the prospect of an impenetrable border wall. If the Trump administration physically seals the border, no jaguars will be able to reach the U.S. on their own, causing them to vanish from the U.S., likely forever."

son region. "Don't put your garbage out until collection day, don't put excess food out for birds and bunnies, feed your pets inside, and don't leave small pets outside unattended. If there's nothing to eat or drink in your neighborhood, wildlife will usually keep moving on."

#### Don't Run And Report

If you come across a lion, bear or coyote, AZGFD advises you not to run. Make yourself look as big as possible, make lots of noise, throw things and back away slowly. If attacked, fight back by kicking, punching or hitting the animal with a rock or stick.

It's important to report nuisance wildlife because aggressive wildlife that breezes through your yard may attack a neighbor's pet or a child. If you see wildlife in places where they don't belong or acting strangely, call the Arizona Game and Fish Department's 24-hour Radio Room at 623-236-7201.

"We hope people will follow these simple rules to help discourage wildlife from getting into trouble," said Hart.

or Kastmasters out in the middle in the summer. For bass, he likes small spinnerbaits all along the shorelines, and pitching brown jigs to the docks. The fish roam between those docks, so a spinnerbait fished around them will also produce.

Also, next to the docks, he recommends twitching a drop shot rig or pitching or skipping a weightless smoke/sparkle worm or lizard underneath. Let some line out,then close the bail and wait to see if the line coils up or moves or twitches. If it does, set the hook.

There are tule patches to fish, as well, and he basically runs the spinnerbaits along the rocky shores and tules until he gets to the docks, then he pitches the docks. He says the best time to fish Rainbow Lake is from April til about the end of July. After that, the lake can get too low to launch a boat.

#### Be Sure To Catch His Show

Johnny is a super guy, and if you want to get a lot more great fishing tips, be sure to catch his show or look him up on You-Tube. He's got tons of great videos there as well, plus you can follow him on Facebook. And don't be afraid to say hi when you see him -he's one of the nicest guys you'll ever meet, plus one of the best fishermen I know.


