The family friendly Expo offers loads of activities, presentations and exhibits for everyone ranging from novices to seasoned outdoor recreationists. Best of all, admission and parking are free.

Activities and attractions include educational live wildlife exhibits (raptors, reptiles, small mammals, more), the huge catch-and-release fishing tanks for kids, target archery, camping demos, the opportunity to try out target shooting and specialty shooting disciplines on the range, off-highway vehicle exhibits and rock crawler demonstrations, field courses, boating



safety exhibits, hunting dog demonstrations, exciting cowboy mounted shooting competition, presentations on wildlife and outdoor recreation, tips from local experts, and the chance to visit with more than 150 exhibitors, including outdoor organizations, government agencies, and vendors of out-door products and services.

Update your boating safety knowledge

Life Jackets

When preparing to go out on a boat, the operator should check that the safety equipment is on board.

- ◆ All boats, except sailboards and certain racing shells or rowing skulls, must have at east one wearable Type I, II, III, or V life jacket (PFD) that is U.S. Coast Guardapproved and of the proper size for each rson on board. Sizing for life jackets (PFDs) is based on body weight and chest
- All life jackets (PFDs) must be in good and serviceable condition and must be readily accessible.
- In addition to the above requirements, vessels 16 feet in length or longer, except a canoe or kayak, must have one Type IV U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket (PFD) on board and readily accessible
- All children 12 years of age and younger *must wear* a U.S. Coast Guard-approved Type I, II, or III life jacket (PFD) while derway on any veseel. The life jacket (PFD) must be fastened according to the manufacturer's recommended use and must fit the child properly.
- Each person on a PWC must wear a U.S. Coast Guard-approved Type I, II, or III life jacket; and all closures must be fastened according to the manufacturer's design or recommended use and must be adjusted for a snug fit.
- Each person being towed behind a boat on water skis or a similar device must wear a USCG-approved life jacket (PFD) or buoyant belt. Note, however, that buoyant belts are not aproved by the U.S. Coast Guard

TYPE I: Offshore Life Jackets

These vests are geared for rough or remote waters where rescue may take awhile. They provide the most buoyancy, are excellent for flotation, and will turn most unconscious persons face up in the water.

TYPE II: Near-Shore Vests

These vests are good for calm waters when quick rescue is likely. A Type II may not turn some unconscious wearers face up in the water.



TYPE III: Flotation Aids

These vests or full-sleeved jackets are good for calm waters when quick rescue is likely. They are not for rough waters since they will not turn most unconscious persons face up.



TYPE IV: Throwable Devices

These cushions and ring buoys are designed to be thrown to someone in trouble. Since a Type IV is not designesd to be worn, it is neither for rough waters nor for persons who are unable to hold onto it.

TYPE V: Special-Use Devices

These vests, deck suits, hybrid PFDs, and others are designed for specific activities such as windsurfing, kayaking, or water-skiing. To be acceptable, Type V PFDs must be used in accordance with their label.

Inflatable Life Jackets must have a full cylinder, green status indicators, and an accessible and intact lanyard or lever. Non-hybrid inflatable lifejackets (no foam) are only for persons at least 16 vears old.

Five On-the-Water Towboat Captains Honored For Heroism

Arizona's Capt. Sean McKinney, Vessel Assist Lake Havasu, takes top honor.



With over 600 tow spread across boats North America, the law of averages dictates that, eventually, BoatUS towing captains will be thrust into the middle of lifethreatening emergencies. BoatUS Towing Services recently honored five of its capfour with tains -

Meritorious Service Awards and one with the BoatUS "Woody Pollack Lifesaving Award" — at a ceremony that recently capped off the group's annual conference held in Clearwater Beach, Fla.

The Woody Pollack award is named after the well-respected towboat captain in the fleet who died at an early age.

'Sometimes the routine of a normal day is interrupted by a life-threatening mayday call or an incident that unfolds in front of them, and our captains step in without hesitation," said BoatUS Vice President and Director of Towing Adam Wheeler.

They are not in the rescue business. but their actions save others. We are very proud of them." US Coast Guard Chief of Search and Rescue, Captain Peter Martin, presented the awards on behalf of Boat Owners Association of The United States (BoatUS). Here are the details on the Lake Havasu incident:

Woody Pollack Lifesaving Award To Arizona Captain

One Saturday afternoon last summer, Capt. Sean McKinney of Vessel Assist, Lake Havasu, Ariz., was providing a routine tow to a BoatUS member in Havasu Springs Marina until piercing screams shot through the field of boat slips. McKinney quickly dropped the tow and found the source of the sound a few slips way was the mother of a seven-year-old boy who had jumped off the stern of the family's powerboat as the boy's father was backing into the slip.

Carrying his first aid kit, just like the one he had in the US Army as a combat lifesaver, McKinney raced into action. The boy had two deep prop cuts to the bone on the calf, and was bleeding badly. Captain McKinney quickly applied a tourniquet,



AS BOATING SEASON BEGINS AGAIN

Now Is The Time To Review Boating's Four Principles

A boating accident, often resulting in property damage, personal injury, or more tragically a death, is a terrible way to introduce anyone to the world of boating and water-related recreational activity.

2011, the most current year for which we have Coast Guard annual statistics, was the most catastrophic year since 1998 in the United States for boating-related deaths, injuries and property damage. We now have an opportunity to change our behavior and avoid becoming a similar statistic for last year - 2012.

Terrible Tragedies

While many call the 758 heartbreaking



deaths and 4.588 boating incidents recorded during 2011 "accidents," following even the most basic rules of good and prudent seamanship would eliminate most, if not all, of these terrible events and the resulting tragic consequences they create.

True enough, you may not be planning an open ocean voyage of several days or weeks and see little need for the basic rules of seamanship to guide your planning for a day on the lake or a weekend fishing trip on the river. But, I can tell you that the water doesn't know the difference and quite often the reason that an ocean voyage is (seemingly) safer is because boaters take the potential hazards seriously and prepare properly beforehand.

Colorado River No Exception

The Colorado River and western inland lakes pose many of the same hazards and opportunities for problems that ocean-going boats and sailors experience—and in some extreme situations — even more.

There are many things to consider before getting out on your favorite body of water with the boat during the year, and the United States Coast Guard joins the National Safe Boating Council and others in offering four easy-to-follow basic principles for a safer year for you and your family on the water before you do. Simply stated, the four principles are as follow:

Wearing life jackets saves lives: Most, into all, boating-safety education professionals agree that the one single thing that would contribute the most to reducing deaths and saving lives would be wearing life jackets. Statistics show time and time again that many boating fatalities could have been avoided if the victim had only been wearing a life jacket. Wearing a life jacket while boating is like wearing a seat belt when driving or riding in a car. Wear one anytime you are on a boat or even near the water or on a boat dock. And, with the new inflatable life jacket technology in the marketplace, a variety of life jackets are available for those over the age of 16 that

are not bulky, hot or uncomfortable. Don't forget that for those boaters who are 12 years of age or younger, the law requires them to wear a life jacket (properly sized, fitted and worn to the manufacturer's specifications) any time they're on a boat that is underway (not at anchor, made fast to the shore or aground) — even when launching or retrieving your boat.

Boater education saves lives: Get, be and stay prepared: Take a boating safety education course. Statistics show that more than 80 percent of those involved in boating fatalities have never taken a boating safety course or had any other type of formal boating education. The Coast Guard Auxiliary, Power Squadron, state agencies and others have excellent volunteer instructors who offer numerous classes across the country throughout the year. These National Association of State Boating Law Administrator (NASBLA) certified courses offer introductory and basic information in such subject areas as different boat types, things you need to know before getting underway, how to tow and operate your boat correctly, legal requirements, basic weather, boating emergencies and what to do as well as other interesting subject areas about boats and boating. The instructors are knowledgeable, eager, able and ready to help you learn more about operating your boat safely and proficiently. These classes are often offered for a modest cost and in many cases are completely free of charge. Once you complete the brief introductory eight-hour course, check with your insurance agent as most companies offer a reduced insurance premium to educated boat owners and opera-

<u>Safe boats save lives:</u> Get a free Vessel Safety Check from the Coast Guard Auxiliary or Power Squadron. Boats that are properly equipped, in good operating condition, and safe from hazards are less likely to be involved in accidents and fatalities. While the law doesn't require certain items or supplies such as an anchor, visual dis-

tress signals or other safety equipment on inland lakes, Federal requirements on the Colorado River and coast are more stringent and demanding. Local marine law-enforcement officers would be happy to check your boat for you as well. Contact representatives of the Coast Guard Auxiliary or Power Squadron to request a free Vessel Safety Check by visiting www.safetyseal.net and clicking on "I WANT A VSC." Learn what you need to have to make sure your boat is always seaworthy and ready to go.

Sober boating saves lives: Avoid alcohol and other drugs while on or near the water. Approximately 40 percent of all boating fatalities involve the use of alcohol. If you are drunk and get into an accident on the water, but are fortunate enough to survive, you will likely suffer financial and personal consequences such as large fines and the possible loss of automobile driving privileges. Drugs and alcohol don't just impact the boat operator; passengers who have been drinking alcohol, for example, are 10 times more likely to fall overboard. And, if they aren't wearing life jackets, possibly face drowning. You hear it all the time: Water and alcohol don't mix! Arizona is a zero-tolerance state and that means any boat operator impaired to the slightest degree could be arrested. Don't risk a great day on the water—keep a good day good and go home safe.

Safe Boating Is No Accident

Following these four basic boating principles will help keep you safe. The United States Coast Guard and your local and state boating enforcement and education agencies hope that you and your loved ones enjoy boating during 2013 and in the years to come. Safe boating is no accident — keep a good day on the water good by following these four easy-to-follow basic principles.

LAKE POWELL FISHING In Spite Of Cold Weather, Anglers Are Successful

It's been a cold winter at Lake Powell. Water surface temperature bottomed out at 44 F and presently fluctuates between 45 at night and 47 during the "heat" of the day. Water level continues to decrease resulting in the closure of the Castle Rock Cut and the primitive launch ramps at Hite. Luckily, the last cold spell featured an increase in the snow pack in Colorado, which means there will be some runoff this spring.

On the bright side, those anglers who continue to bundle up and venture out have had some very positive success. Bass fishing is slow but occasional bites in the backs of canyons near brush produce some very nice largemouth weighing from 3 to 7 pounds

Water-level decline strands more and more brush each day so the best bass canyons are those that have long, flat flood plains with ample brush.

Examples of canyons with long flood plains are Wahweap, Warm Creek and Navajo on the southern end. Mid-lake canyons include Halls Creek, Escalante, San Juan and Red Canyon. Find sub-merged brush and largemouth are close by.

Striped bass schools remain in the backs of the canyons, roaming from 70-foot depths into 25-foot shallows. At Bullfrog, the closest reliable fishing spot is near Dome Rock on the west end of the Bullfrog houseboat field. At Wahweap the closest spot is near Lone Rock

There are some shad left in the backs of the canvons so stripers remain there and continue to search for food each day.

When fishing for schooling stripers, the best strategy is to troll with a deep-diving lure or with down riggers or leaded line. Watch the graph to locate schools while

When a school is observed, mark the spot by tossing a floating marker over the side but continue to troll hoping that the school fish will take the trolled lure. If there are no takers, return to the marker and jig vertically near bottom with spoons The goal is to hook the first fish, which triggers the whole school into feeding

A troll-hooked fish is often followed by school mates. As that fish is being netted, drop spoons to the bottom to light up the

Not Just A Hunt

"We'll have a number of presentations, archery will be available, and of course we'll be sitting around the campfire away from our computers and the pressures of everyday life," said Darren Tucker, wildlife manager for Game and Fish. "The focus is to get folks outdoors.

"This is the ideal opportunity for parents to spend some great time with their children.

Need New Hunters

Tucker is quick to explain there is a need to recruit new hunters, although there's more to this endeavor.

"We understand not everyone wants to hunt, but it is important to understand the critical role hunters play in modern wildlife management," he explained. "Hunting and fishing dollars are the primary funding for wildlife management in Arizona with no burden on the taxpayer.

"I know there will be a focus on the 'hunt'. but this is really about getting outside and spending time with family and

Activities, Displays
Activities available will include shooting archery, and how-to demonstrations will cover wildlife viewing, predator calling, javelina natural history and hunting, glassing and use of binoculars, wild game care, and basic camping skills. There will also be exhibitor areas to explore local sportsmen's groups, manufacturers of outdoor equipment, and retailers of outdoor equipment.

A limited number of volunteers will be available for youth hunters under 18 years old. Those interested in a mentor must preregister for the mentored hunting program All youth must be accompanied by a legal guardian at all times

All those hunting are responsible for their own transportation to the hunting area and this is not a guided hunt. Participants are also responsible for their own camping equipment, hunting equipment, and food. Weather in February throughout the state can be unpredictable, so dress appropriately

school of trailing fish. Spooning may result in many stripers being caught in short order.

When the school moves on troll to relocate them, hook one and then repeat the process by dropping spoons once more. This combination of trolling and spooning is very effective and has resulted in big catches of stripers during late winter over the length of Lake Powell.

Using this procedure was very good for me on Jan. 31. We trolled deep Thundersticks near Lone Rock and found stripers holding at 35 feet. We caught one fish trolling and another 12 using spoons. We caught another fish trolling and then 10 more with spoons from the second school.

When those fish moved on, we trolled


for the third time. This time a big striper hit the clear/white Deep Thunderstick. It took 10 minutes to subdue the 15-pound striper that was 34 inches long and 20 inches around.


Bigger stripers are more often found in deep main channel water. On Jan. 20, Jesse Pond was trolling with his dad Sean from Denver, Colo. They began trolling a perch-colored Deep Thunderstick on leaded line at the mouth of Forgotten Canyon and hooked a big fish after trolling for only 15 minutes. It took 13-year-old Jesse an hour to subdue his 28.3-pound striper.

Despite the cold weather, fishing is still good at Lake Powell. It may be the best time to catch a trophy fish. We guarantee that you will have the big beautiful lake almost to yourself. You are all invited to experience Lake Powell in the winter.

Keep Wildlife Wild; Humans, Pets, Safe

Although it is winter in most parts of the state, wildlife encounters still occur. The Arizona Game and Fish Department wants to pass along a few reminders to avoid conflicts with wildlife and how you can help keep wildlife wild.

Arizona is an amazing state, home to more than 800 wildlife species and close to 7 million people. Based on those numbers, humans and wildlife do occasionally cross paths. Although encounters do happen, Game and Fish encourages everyone to get outside and enjoy Arizona's diverse

Enjoy With Safety, Respect

The key is to remember some of the following tips:

- Do not feed wildlife, as this will change an animal's behavior. Wild animals that are fed regularly will lose their fear of humans, and adult animals teach young to be dependent on humans for food. This also encourages predators to search for prey in neighborhoods where they do not
- · Keep pets on a leash and in view at all times.
- If hiking or camping, learn about the wildlife in the area and their habitats and keep food in tightly secured containers, not in a tent or in your sleeping area.
- · Enjoy wildlife from a distance, don't get too close, especially to females with
- · If you see an animal that looks sick or injured, it is best to leave it alone and contact a regional Game and Fish office or

local animal control.

• If a bite or exposure has occurred, seek medical attention immediately and call the local health department or Game and Fish

Rabies is a wildlife disease that affects mammals, including humans. It more typically occurs in bats, skunks and foxes, but there is the potential for other wildlife to carry rabies, and an outbreak can occur at any time of the year.

People can get rabies from the bite of an infected animal, or if saliva from the animal gets directly into a person's eyes, nose, mouth or any break in the skin.

In Arizona, approximately 30 people are exposed to rabid animals every year. The most recent, at the beginning of January 2013, was a bite from a rabid fox near Sedona. The last documented human rabies death in Arizona was in 1981. One way to keep the potential for rabies expo-sures down is to leave wildlife alone. And, Around Your Home

In an effort to keep wildlife wild, here are tips for around your home:

- · Do not feed wildlife; this occurs intentionally and unintentionally in neighborhoods throughout Arizona.
- · Keep pet food and water inside and trash cans secured.
- · Keep pets contained; remember not to let them in the yard if wildlife is present. If taking pets on a walk, they should be on
- · Remove things that attract wildlife such as food, shelter, and water. Plan your landscaping appropriately: the trees and plants you use may create great shelter and food sources for wildlife.
- · Remember that a simple bird feeder can attract other animals besides birds, such as deer and javelina. It can also attract smaller animals that could be potential prey for larger unwanted animals. A bird feeder should be at least 6 feet above the ground and away from trees, decks or planters. It is always a good idea to have a device attached to the feeder that can catch the seed and keep it from falling onto the

ground.
• Install outdoor lighting; this may frighten wildlife from your home

Make possible den sites or shelters, including the crawl spaces under homes, unavailable by blocking them with fencing or other devices.

- · If allowed in the area where you live, use fences and walls at least 6 feet high. with the bottom buried a few inches under-
- · Ask your neighbors to follow these same steps.

"In our region we have dealt with wildlife issues involving everything from deer to javelina to bears," says Larry Phoenix, Flagstaff area field supervisor. "We have learned that most human/wildlife conflicts in urban areas occur because humans are intentionally or unintentionally providing food, water, or shelter to wildlife.'

Phoenix adds, "Urban wildlife can cause property damage, and in some cases, become aggressive towards people, and the last thing we want to do is remove or kill an animal because of human behavior that could have been avoided."

A Community Effort

Reducing conflicts between people and wildlife must be a neighborhood or community effort to be truly effective. If one person in a neighborhood is still feeding wildlife, that person is attracting the animals to the whole neighborhood. Work with your neighbors. Create a community-wide effort. Remember to help keep wildlife from coming into conflict with people because when that happens, everyone loses.

"By providing free admission, we are putting out an invitation to all Americans to visit and enjoy these extraordinary treasures that belong to all our people."

Tourism and outdoor recreation are also powerful economic engines in communities across the country. Recreation on federal lands in 2009 provided 440,000 jobs and contributed \$55 billion to the economy.

The fee waiver does not cover expanded amenity or user fees for things such as camping, boat launches, transportation, or special tours

Active duty military members and their dependents are eligible for a free annual pass that provides entrance to lands managed by the National Park Service, U.S.

Fish & Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management, Bureau of Reclamation, and the U.S. Forest Service. The America the Beautiful National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass Program also offers a free lifetime pass for people with disabilities, a \$10 lifetime senior pass for those age 62 and over, and a \$80 annual pass for the general public.
